RESOLUTION NO. 79-51

STATE EMPLOYEE SALARIES

WHEREAS:

1. The State Water Resources Control Board and the Regional Water Quality Control Boards administer a complex water rights program, a multi-billion dollar sewage treatment plant construction program, and a regulatory program to keep California's water clean; and
2. The Boards strongly endorse delivering the best possible service at the lowest possible cost; and
3. The Boards support the concept of reduced spending in government in general and within the water resources control program; and
4. Dramatic salary and benefit increases, as high as 42 percent over state levels, have lured some of the best State and Regional Board employees to other public and private employment; and
5. The loss of these employees will adversely affect the Boards' program of achieving water quality and water allocation objectives.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:


That the State Water Resources Control Board strongly supports state employee salaries commensurate with skills and ability, along with a balance in the number of total employees commensurate with program needs, which can lead to a net reduction in government spending.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the State Water Resources Control Board requests the Governor to consider this approach in his negotiations and decisions on state employee salaries.
