REVISED GRANT ELIGIBLE CAPACITY FOR THE MONTEREY
REGIONAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL AGENCY TREATMENT PLANT
PROJECT NO. C-06-1066-120

WHEREAS:


1. Facilities planning for the Monterey Regional Project was completed in 1977, and concept approval for the regional project has been issued;
2. A Step 2 grant was awarded on October 18, 1977, for design of the regional project;
3. The Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency contends that the approved grant eligible treatment plant loadings do not reflect current plant loading conditions;
4. The Agency has requested an amendment to concept approval to increase grant eligible loadings consistent with more recent monitoring data. The Agency is also asking that additional eligibility be approved for adding septage handling facilities to the proposed regional treatment plant. Data has been submitted to support the Agency's request;
5. Staff has reviewed all of the data submitted and determined that an increase to the grant eligible capacity for the regional treatment plant is justified; and
6. State grant regulations Section 3636(a) require in part that "no additional eligible capacity shall be considered for projects in Step 2." In accordance with Section 3659 of the regulations, the eligibility limitation can be waived by the State Board.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

The State Board waives the requirements of Section 3636(a) of the State regulations. Staff is directed to prepare a concept approval amendment adjusting the grant eligible loading for the proposed Monterey regional treatment plant to include a BOD₅ loading of 42,375 pounds per day and a suspended solids loading of 45,235 pounds per day.
