

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD
RESOLUTION NO. 92-21

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO
ALLOCATE \$150,000 FROM FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR (FFY) 1990
CLEAN WATER ACT TITLE II FUNDS FOR THE ONGOING
HYDROGEOLOGIC INVESTIGATION AT THE PENN MINE

WHEREAS:


1. State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) Resolution No. 91-8 authorized the Executive Director to expend up to \$8.75 million of FFY 1990 Clean Water Act Title II funds for Nonpoint Source (NPS) activities. This money will be used, in part, to provide funding over an extended period for NPS program staff.
2. Acid mine drainage from the Penn Mine site is a serious NPS water quality problem.
3. Both short- and long-term remedial measures are underway to address the Penn Mine water quality problem.
4. The U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) has begun a comprehensive hydrogeologic study of the Penn Mine site pursuant to an interagency agreement.
5. The ground water data collected from the ongoing cooperative USGS hydrogeologic investigation is important in developing an effective remediation of the Penn Mine site.
6. Additional funding is necessary to complete the report.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Water Board authorizes the Executive Director or his designee to allocate \$150,000 from the FFY 1990 Clean Water Act Title II account to fund a portion of the ongoing cooperative USGS hydrogeologic investigation at Penn Mine, subject to the availability of matching funds.
