

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD
RESOLUTION NO. 93-75

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE AN INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES REGARDING STATE OVERSIGHT AT UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY FACILITIES

WHEREAS:


1. The United States Department of Energy (DOE) has established an Environmental Restoration and Waste Management Five-Year Plan to bring all of its facilities into compliance with the letter and spirit of state and federal environmental laws, regulations, and requirements.
2. Communication and coordination with State agencies is critical to DOE's success in this endeavor.
3. DOE and the State of California have entered into an Agreement-In-Principle (AIP) which designates the Department of Health Services (DHS) as lead State agency for the AIP program.
4. During the last two years, the State and Regional Water Boards have provided assistance in implementing the AIP program by performing water quality oversight of DOE environmental compliance activities.
5. DOE will provide financial resources through DHS to reimburse the State and Regional Water Boards for \$555,225 for Fiscal Year (FY) 1993-94 and \$48,276 for the first month of FY 1994-95.
6. An Interagency Agreement between the State Water Board and DHS has been drafted which provides such funds to the State and Regional Boards and represents a commitment by the State Water Board to conduct oversight of DOE environmental compliance activities on a timely, constructive, and fiscally sound basis.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The State Board authorizes and directs the Executive Director or his designee to execute an Interagency Agreement for the period July 1, 1993 to July 31, 1994 with the Department of Health Services regarding State oversight at United States Department of Energy facilities.
