RESOLUTION NO. 94-109

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO  
ACCEPT/AMEND A CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA) SECTION 319  
NONPOINT SOURCE (NPS) IMPLEMENTATION GRANT AND  
TO APPROVE AN NPS IMPLEMENTATION GRANT PRIORITY LIST

WHEREAS:

1. The CWA Section 319 reserves grant funds for states to implement NPS management programs.
2. The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) is the designated State agency in California to administer the NPS Program.
3. The SWRCB approved an NPS Management Plan on November 15, 1988 which includes activities that the SWRCB and the nine California Regional Water Quality Control Boards (RWQCBs) will undertake to control NPS pollution.
4. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) has projected that its Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 1995 CWA Section 319 grant allocation to the SWRCB will be approximately \$5.7 million.
5. The SWRCB's NPS Section has distributed a Request for Proposals for grant-funded NPS projects. An NPS project priority list has been prepared by the NPS Coordinating Committee jointly with the NPS Interagency Advisory Committee.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The SWRCB approves the attached NPS project priority list. The project priority list will be submitted to USEPA for funding with FFY 1995 CWA Section 319 resources.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT:


The SWRCB authorizes the Executive Director or his designee to:

1. Apply for and accept/amend FFY 1995 CWA Section 319(h) grants for an amount up to \$5.7 million for support of the NPS Program.
2. Negotiate and approve program workplans not affecting the total grant amount.

3. Negotiate and execute contracts and amendments in accordance with the program workplans.
