### STATEWIDE GENERAL ORDER

On May 20, 2004, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted a Statewide General NPDES Permit for Discharges of Aquatic Pesticides to Surface Waters of the United States for Vector Control (Vector Control Permit). The Vector Control Permit regulates the discharge of pollutants associated with the application of aquatic pesticides for vector control. It requires dischargers to develop and implement Best Management Practices during applications. It also contains monitoring requirements to assess compliance with receiving water limits.

Dischargers seeking enrollment into the General Order must submit to the appropriate Regional Water Quality Control Board a notice of intent, annual fee (for first time filers), a project map, and a discharger monitoring plan to comply with the Vector Control Permit prior to any proposed discharge.
