• Report from Vice Chair Secundy:

- O Vice-Chair Secundy started by saying the reason the Board canceled the meeting at the end of March was lack of a quorum and for item 10; he has to recuse himself because he is a part-time resident in the Lake Arrowhead area and there will not be a full quorum.
- o Announced as of March 21, Chair Doduc and Vice Chair Secundy have completed their first year with the Water Board.

 Signed a memo to the Air Resources Board (ARB) Chair Dr. Bob Sawyer, designating Vice Chair Secundy as a State Water Board liaison to the Air Board's air and water issues.

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• Report from Member Baggett:

- Orville Re licensing Settlement: Staffs from all the fish agencies and State contractors and environmental communities have been negotiating over 7 years and spent \$70 million. Over 9-month period crafted a settlement for over a billion dollars.
- o Klamath Process: Have been working on it for 4 years and still an ongoing issue.
- 3. Status update on implementation of State Water Resources Control Board Resolution No. 2005-0060 requiring development of a revised Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) for mercury in the San Francisco Bay

Ms. Jennings also clarified the policy language Chair Doduc asked for. Ms. Jennings continues to say (in reference to the draft order on page 4) this Policy is almost thirty years old. In recognition of the importance of water reclamation, the State Water Board is preparing an updated Policy for adoption this year. This Policy provides, in part: "The State Board and the Regional Boards shall (1) encourage reclamation and reuse of water in water-short areas of the State, (2) encourage water conservation measures which further extend the water resources of the State, and (3) encourage other agencies . . . to assist in implementing this policy."
