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CUSTOMER SERVICE AWARDS

~David Boyers was awarded the Sustained Superior Accomplishment Award for his ongoing work performance in the Office of Chief Counsel for contributions protecting groundwater resources.

Boyers continuously provides high-quality and prompt legal services to his clients in the State Board's Underground Storage Tank Program. Boyers has a tremendous ability to understand, mediate and effectively resolve diverging viewpoints, Chief Counsel Michael Lauffer said. Boyers has demonstrated exceptional proficiency in creating and developing legislative approaches and language. For example, Boyers wrote many provisions of Assembly Bill 2481, including the groundbreaking requirements that resulted in the first significant advances in the Underground storage tank construction standards. He was also responsible for initiating several legislative changes necessary for California's Underground Storage Tank Program to obtain state program approval from U.S. EPA. Boyers' superior work has resulted in a significant service not only to staff of the UST program and the Water Board but also to the people of the State of California, Lauffer said.

5. Consideration of a resolution approving an amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the San Diego Region to incorporate a total maximum daily load for dissolved copper, lead, and zinc in Chollas Creek (Map)

Greg Franz, Division of Water Quality, presented the item to the Board along with James Smith, Environmental Scientist, DWQ; Julie Chan, Senior Engineer, DWQ; and Steven Blum, Office of Chief Counsel.

(Before the Board made a decision, Mr. Lauffer conferred with the DWQ and San Diego Regional Water Board staff. The Board meeting reconvened at 1:30 p.m.)

Both Chair Doduc and Vice Chair Secundy were ready to make a decision, but since there was a concern with the recirculation and comment period for the CEQA document, Chair Doduc asked for a remand. Vice-Chair Secundy wanted a time-line from staff.

Mr. Lauffer suggests leaving findings 5 and 6. Strike findings 3, and 7 through 12 and replace with the new findings "During the State Water Board's consideration of this item, the City of San Diego raised concerns about the adequacy of the San Diego Water Board's compliance with its certified regulatory program requirements to implement the California Environmental Quality Act. While the State Water Board does not agree that the San Diego Water Board failed to adequately consider the significant environmental points, the State Water Board remands this Basin Plan amendment so that the San Diego Water Board, in the first instance, can consider the comments of interested persons on the substitute environmental document". The resolved clause will be stricken and replaced with "THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Pursuant to Water Code section 13245, the State Water Board hereby remands the Basin Plan amendment to implement a metals TMDL for Chollas Creek for further deliberations consistent with the State Water Board's regulations and applicable laws".

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Chair Doduc includes a request that the TMDL be acted on by the San Diego regional water board within 3 months. Member Baggett requested an amendment to the remand resolution stating that additional compliance time should be provided, similar to metals TMDL in the Ballona Creek and Los Angeles River watersheds. The amendment offered by Chair Doduc was accepted into the motion. The amendment offered by Member Baggett was not accepted into the motion.

STATEWIDE INITIATIVES

7. Consideration of adoption of statewide general waste discharge requirements for publicly owned sanitary sewer systems

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Bryan Brock, Office of Statewide Initiative, presented the item (<u>slideshow</u>) to the Board along with Sheila Vassey, Office of Chief Counsel.

The Board adopted STATEWIDE GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SANITARY SEWER SYSTEMS and the associated monitoring and reporting program by issuing ORDER NO. 2006-0003, on May 2, 2006. Order adoption was contingent upon monitoring and reporting changes and other minor changes to the WDR that were presented by staff at the meeting. Additionally, time schedule changes presented by staff at the meeting were discussed and slightly altered by the Board members. The time schedule allows for an additional six months for most of the compliance schedule tasks, but the additional time allowance is dependant upon executing a memorandum of agreement, by July 1, 2006, with a statewide wastewater organization providing online SSO database and SSMP development training.
