## WATER QUALITY – PUBLIC HEARING

9. Public Hearing to consider whether a stay should remain in effect on Petition of Humboldt Watershed Council and Environmental Protection Information Center (Enrollment of Pacific Lumber Company Timber Harvesting Plans under General Waste Discharge Requirements, Order No. R1-2004-0030) SWRCB/OCC File No. A-1692

Chair Doduc gave an opening statement before starting the meeting and said, "This is the time and place for the hearing on a Request for Stay filed by the Humboldt Watershed Council, the Environmental Protection Information Center, and the Sierra Club (Petitioners) regarding timber harvesting plans proposed by the Pacific Lumber Company in the Freshwater Creek and Elk River drainages; because of action taken by North Coast Regional Water Board, which adopted watershed wide waste discharge requirements for Freshwater Creek in the Elk River. Chief Counsel, Michael Lauffer, has advised the State Water Board, that this Regional Board action, coupled with the language of enrollment letters at issuing this petition, and the order in the Superior Court Judge have rendered moot the issuance of Stay in this matter. The State Water Board has been advised, there is nothing to Stay. An order of that effect has been prepared, circulated, and is before the Board today. The petitioner(s) do not intend to offer any evidence in support of a Stay and agreed the matter moot".
