#### **Discharger and Tentative Order Information**

San Andreas Sanitary District (hereinafter Discharger) is the owner and operator of the San Andreas Sanitary District Wastewater Treatment Plant (hereinafter Facility), a publicly owned treatment works located at 675 Gold Oak Road, San Andreas, California. The Facility provides sewerage service for portions of the town of San Andreas, serving a population of around 2,200. Treated wastewater is stored on-site and is disposed of via spray irrigation to land within the property boundaries of the Facility during the dry season. Due to insufficient storage capacity to contain all treated wastewater during the wet season, the Discharger is authorized to discharge up to 1.5 million gallons per day of treated effluent to the North Fork Calaveras River, a water of the United States, when 20:1 dilution (river water to effluent) is achieved.

Discharges from the Facility are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements Order R5-2018-0075, issued by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) on 5 October 2018. An Order is proposed to renew the NPDES permit. The tentative Order includes updated effluent limitations for ammonia and cyanide.

### **Nature and Purpose of Hearing**

At the hearing, the Central Valley Water Board will hear testimony and oral comments regarding the tentative Order. This proceeding will be a formal adjudicatory proceeding. The <u>procedures governing Central Valley Water Board adjudicatory hearings</u> (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/laws\_regulations/) may be found at California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 648 et seq. and are available upon request.

#### **Prehearing Submission of Written Comments and Evidence**

The written comment period has closed for this item. Interested persons were previously invited to submit written comments concerning the tentative Order. Pursuant to the Notice of Public Hearing, dated 12 December 2023, comments were due by 5:00 p.m. on 11 January 2024.

Written materials submitted after the close of the written comment period will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record, absent a ruling by the Board Chair.

#### **Visual Presentations**

Hearing participants may use PowerPoint or other visual presentations at the hearing, but the presentation content shall not exceed the scope of previously submitted written material. Presentations, if any, must be provided to the Central Valley Water Board Contact by 12:00 p.m. on **16 April 2024**.

#### **Hearing Procedure and Time Limits**

The hearing on the tentative Order will be conducted in the general order listed under California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 648.5, except that the Board Chair may modify the order for good cause.

The **Discharger** and any other designated Party will be advised in advance of the hearing of the total amount of time allocated for their presentation and closing statement. The Discharger is invited to contact staff in advance of the hearing to discuss how much time they believe is necessary.

**Interested persons** may speak at the hearing and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals, if any. Each interested person will have 3 minutes to present oral comments. Additional time may be provided, upon request, at the discretion of the Board Chair.
