Subject: FEBRUARY 8 WEEKLY UPDATE ON CURTAILMENT STATUS OF WATER RIGHTS AND CLAIMS IN THE DELTA WATERSHED – NO CHANGES TO CURTAILMENT STATUS

This email contains important information about the curtailment status of water rights and claims of right within the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta (Delta) watershed pursuant to orders that were issued on August 20, 2021 (Order for water rights/claims under 5,000 acre-feet and Order for water rights/claims over 5,000 acre-feet).

There have been no changes to curtailment statuses since February 2, 2022. Water supply forecasts will continue to be evaluated regularly to determine if, when, and to what extent the further re-imposition or suspension of curtailments may be appropriate, and the next curtailment status update will be provided by email and web posting no later than February 15, 2022. Please check the <u>Delta Watershed Curtailment Status</u> <u>List</u> for the current curtailment status of each water right and claim in the Delta watershed.

The following priorities of right remain curtailed unless and until the State Water Board advises that this determination has been updated:

- 1. Water rights and claims on the following Sacramento River tributaries:
 - a. Post-1914 appropriative water rights and pre-1914 appropriative water right claims in the <u>Cache Creek</u> subwatershed with a priority date of 1856 or later;
 - b. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the <u>Stony Creek</u> subwatershed with a priority date of 1921 or later; and
 - c. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the <u>Putah Creek</u> subwatershed outside of the Legal Delta with a priority date of 1945 or later.
- 2. Water rights and claims on the following San Joaquin River tributaries:
 - a. Post-1914 appropriative water rights and pre-1914 appropriative water right claims in the <u>Fresno River</u> subwatershed with a priority date of 1873 or later;
 - Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the <u>Mokelumne River</u> subwatershed outside of the Legal Delta with a priority date of 1949 or later;
 - c. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the <u>Calaveras River</u> subwatershed outside of the Legal Delta with a priority date of 1959 or later; and
 - d. Post-1914 appropriative water rights in the <u>Chowchilla River</u> subwatershed with a priority date of 1959 or later.

Available water supplies from precipitation events in December have declined following a historically warm and dry January. Forecasts for the next two weeks show no sign of meaningful precipitation in the Delta watershed, and support further reimposition of curtailments. Reimposition of additional curtailments will be considered following minor

updates to the Water Unavailability Methodology that are currently planned to be released within the next week.

Water right holders and claimants are responsible for monitoring their curtailment status online on the <u>Delta Watershed Curtailment Status List</u>. Notice of changes to curtailment status will not be mailed. For those with limited internet access, a prerecorded curtailment summary can be heard on the Delta Curtailment Status phone line at (916) 323-4643.

The determination of water unavailability used to inform curtailments is based on the <u>Water Unavailability Methodology for the Delta Watershed</u>. The data used to support curtailments and other relevant information is available on the State Water Board's FTP site.
