State Water Board Approves \$75,000 Grant For Camrosa Water District Recycled Water Project

SACRAMENTO — The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) today approved the expenditure of \$75,000 for a Water Recycling Facilities Planning Grant for the Camrosa Water District.

The study will determine the feasibility and cost-effectiveness of piping reclaimed (or reusable) water to golf courses, parks, road medians and agricultural areas.

The Camrosa Water District has 9,950 drinking water customers and 7,350 wastewater collection customers.

California voters approved the Safe Drinking Water, Clean Water, Watershed Protection and Flood Protection Act last year. This act authorizes the SWRCB to make water recycling planning grants.

Water recycling grants may cover 50 percent of eligible costs, to a maximum of \$75,000 per study. A total of \$101.7 million is available for water recycling projects, construction grants and loans and facilities planning grants this fiscal year.
