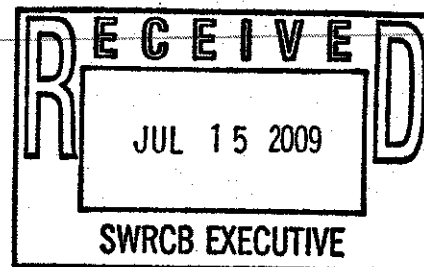

I am a teacher living in the San Luis Obispo County.  
 This may not be the formal way to get my concerns to the board but my time is limited and fatigue is great.

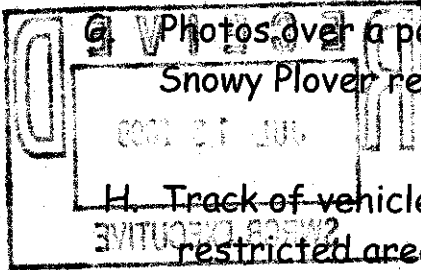
My concerns come personal witnessing to the following items is not hearsay

concerns are as follows:

- A. Gasoline being spilled into the dunes area of Pismo Beach Dunes.  
 amounts by my math 1-3 oz per vehicle ( 150 machines) per hour.  
 The amount could be at 7,000 -9.000 a year. Many bring in containers appearing to be of the size to contain a hundred or more gallons of gasoline  
 My belief is that Federal law requires a concrete slab if gas is dispensed.
- B. Dumping of liquid from the holding tanks of motor home 3 per (2 hr period ) estimated each hold motorhome 50 -100 gallons round the clock day and night seven days a week all year.  $300 \times 12 = 3,600$  per day  
 $3,600 \times 30 \text{ days} = 108,000 \text{ gal}$  in a year approx.  
 pictures of this being done.
- C The vibrations from 45,000 - 1.5 million vehichles causing harassment to Snowy plover, Least Tern Red legged frog, Steel-head trout and tide water goby to interfer with reproduction and habitat, mating and stress to the young if they hatch!
- D. Creation of Smog or blue haze when there is 50,000 vehicles present on the beach.
- E. Creation of a health concern from PM 10, PM.5 PM2.5 dust particles to the surrounding communities. One community is being charge a pollution tax on thier property as a result of the Pm10.
- F. Changes to the health of water mamals within the last several months we have had 70 plus animals removed from the beach in

various stages of ill health.

- J. Suspected Portapotty dumping into the sand Photos of suspeicius activity leading to this conclusion. A tank truck with hose into the sand. Photo of this
