O P I N I O N

On July 13, 1925, Mrs. Sara C. Dow filed her application No. 4693 for a permit to appropriate 0.001 cubic feet per second from an unnamed spring in San Bernardino County for domestic purposes at a cabin site she was at the time using under Special Use Permit from the United States Forest Service.

This application was completed in accordance with the Water Commission Act and the requirements of the Rules and Regulations of the Division of Water Rights and being objectionable to the United States Forest Service as hereinafter shown was set for a public hearing at 707 Farm Bldg., Sacramento, at 10:00 A.M. on Tuesday, March 8, 1927. Of this hearing, applicant and the Forest Service were duly advised but no appearance

was made on behalf of either party.

Under date of November 19, 1926, the Division of Water Rights was advised by the Forest Supervisor of San Bernardino National Forest that Mrs. Dow had relinquished her Special Use Permit and therefore had no place upon which to make use of the water for which appropriation is sought. The hearing was set in due course because the Division of Water Rights was unable to secure from Mrs. Dow any statement of her intentions regarding the application.

On March 8, 1927, the Division of Water Rights received a letter signed for Mrs. Dow by Robert House, who had theretofore acted as agent for Mrs. Dow in connection with the application, which letter requested that application No. 4693 be cancelled upon the records of the Division of Water Rights. It is therefore manifest that applicant has abandoned the project covered by the application and no purpose will be served by further consideration thereof.

O R D E R

Application No. 4693 for a permit to appropriate water having been filed with the Division of Water Rights as above stated, the United States Forest Service having advised this office that the appropriation could never be consummated, a public hearing having been held and the Division of Water Rights now being fully informed in the premises:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said application No. 4693 be denied and cancelled upon the records of the Division of Water Rights.
