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OPINION

Applications 13081 and 13082, having been filed and protests against approval thereof having been received and stipulations having been submitted by the applicants and protestant and approved by the Department, was set for field investigation as provided for in said stipulation. Subsequent to the investigation an informal agreement was reached between the parties and the protestant, on March 17, 1950, filed written withdrawals of the protests.

Since the uses to which the applicants propose to put the water sought

are beneficial ones, there would now appear to be no bar to approval of Applications 13081 and 13082 and it is the opinion of this office that said applications should be approved subject to the usual terms and conditions.


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ORDER

Applications 13081 and 13082 for a permit to appropriate water having been filed with the Division of Water Resources as above stated, protests having been filed, a field investigation having been conducted in accordance with Article 13, Section 733(b) of the California Administrative Code and the protests having been subsequently withdrawn:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Application 13081 and 13082 be approved and that permits be issued to the applicants, subject to such of the usual terms and conditions as may be appropriate.
