Members of the SWRCB Staff,

I am writing with regard to SWRCB CDO Condition 2. My understanding is that substantial progress has been made towards a workable regulatory framework. This is important to our community.

For background, I am the Vice President of the Carmel River Watershed Conservancy. Our organization prepared the very first Action Plan for preserving and restoring the watershed. I have served on the Conservancy Board for the past 16 years. I also serve on the Board of the Seaside Groundwater Basin Watermaster. We administer the Seaside basin adjudication. I have served on this board since its inception, including 6 years as its Chairman. I am writing as a ratepayer and resident of the District.

I spoke at the July 19<sup>th</sup> hearing in Sacramento. At that time, I expressed my appreciation that the staff had revised its recommendations and was even more pleased later that day when then Board acted on most of those recommendations. In my comments, I suggested that the staff engage our community and stakeholders in an open and collaborative manner to develop regulations that are consistent with local land use flexibility and decision-making. Consistency and the elimination of confusion were important aspects of the request.

I have since reviewed proposed interpretive language that addresses Condition 2. I wish to express my support for the proposal submitted by the Monterey Peninsula Water Management District on January 3<sup>rd</sup>. The proposed language is consistent with the CDO and addresses the concerns that were expressed by so many of us at the hearing. I believe that it will provide the community with the guidance we need while ensuring that SWRCB's desires are met. I am confident that it will not result in increased water use. The spirit of the CDO is not compromised and our feet remain held to the fire.

This has been a long process for all of us. Too often our fractured community pulls against itself and we become our own worst enemies. In this case, I believe that we have come together for the good of the community and are set to achieve a reasonable outcome.
