- Two people from statewide organizations representing local sanitation agencies, other than agencies which represent municipalities, including counties or private utility wastewater treatment plants.
- A professional engineer specializing in sanitary engineering.
- A person from a university or state university school or division of engineering.
- A member of an organized labor union which represents wastewater treatment plant operators.
- A water recycling operator to represent water recycling treatment plants.
- A current or former member of the U.S. Military who gained experience working, supervising, or managing wastewater treatment within their military service.
