This public notice of draft Certification and Waste Discharge Requirements is provided in satisfaction of Water Code section 13167.5, which pertains to notice of waste discharge requirements. A public notice pertaining to waters of the United States in accordance with the requirements of Section 3858, Title 23, of the California Water Code was provided on May 4, 2021.

State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) staff are proposing to regulate the San Bernardino County Master Stormwater System Maintenance Program (Project) pursuant to Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1341) and the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act (Wat. Code, § 13000 et seq.). This Project will result in impacts to both waters of the United States and other waters of the state. **Staff will consider all comments submitted in writing and received during a 30-day comment period that begins on the first date of issuance of this letter (June 16, 2022) and ends at 5:00 p.m. on the last day of the comment period (July 16, 2022).** To submit comments, or if you have any questions, please contact the State Water Board staff person listed below.

Pursuant to federal law (Title 33, United States Code, Section 1341; Clean Water Act Section 401), applicants for a federal license or permit for activities that may discharge to waters of the United States must seek Water Quality Certification from the state or Indian tribe with jurisdiction. Such Certification is based on a finding that the discharge will meet water quality standards and other applicable requirements. In California, Regional Water Quality Control Boards (Regional Water Boards) issue or deny Certification for discharges within their geographical jurisdiction. The State Water Board has this responsibility for projects affecting waters within multiple Regional Water Board jurisdictions.
