RESOLUTION NO. 69-5

COMMENDING THE DEPARTMENT OF
PARKS AND RECREATION FOR
PUBLICITY COVERAGE OF TRAILER AND CAMPER
WASTE DISPOSAL FACILITIES AND RECOMMENDING
ACTION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH

WHEREAS, the problem of improper disposal of camper and trailer waste was brought to the attention of the State Water Resources Control Board by a representative of the Humboldt-Del Norte County Health Department; and

WHEREAS, subsequently the problem was referred to the Advisory Committee of the State Board; and

WHEREAS, meetings were held with interested parties, both governmental and public; and

WHEREAS, this appears to be a public health problem with possible water quality implications; and

WHEREAS, the number of trailers and campers on the road are expected to increase; and

WHEREAS, facilities for camper and trailer waste disposal have been provided by both private and governmental agencies; and

WHEREAS, a news release was issued concerning existing trailer and camper waste disposal facilities and a map has been distributed showing existing facilities, both prepared by the Department of Parks and Recreation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the State Water Resources Control Board commends the Department of Parks and Recreation for the public relations work accomplished regarding this problem and encourages said Department to continue its effort to make the public aware of the facilities available for the proper disposal of trailer and camper wastes; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the State Board encourages the Department of Public Health through its Health Education Service to promote and publicize the proper use of trailer and camper waste disposal facilities as provided.
