

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD  
RESOLUTION NO. 75-32

DESIGNATING AN AREAWIDE PLANNING AREA AND  
AGENCY FOR THE SAN DIEGO AREA

WHEREAS:

1. On February 20, 1975, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted a "Program for Development and Implementation of Areawide Waste Treatment Management Plans - Part I, designated Areas and Agencies", and said program expressed the Board's policy on planning by agencies designated pursuant to Section 208 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972.
2. The Environmental Protection Agency and Air Resources Board have expressed the desire that planning under Section 208 be closely coordinated with other environmental quality planning.
3. On March 12, 1975, the Executive Officer of the State Water Resources Control Board, acting pursuant to the Board's authority under Section 208 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, identified the San Diego Area as a potential 208 planning area.
4. A public hearing was held in San Diego on April 1, 1975, to receive evidence on the necessity or appropriateness of designating the San Diego Area as an areawide waste treatment management planning area and the appropriate boundaries and planning organization for any area designated.
5. Analysis of testimony received at the public hearing indicates need for areawide planning to deal with the following items:
  - a. Groundwater mineralization
  - b. Wastewater reclamation
  - c. Surface water runoff
  - d. Control and management of nonpoint source pollution loads
  - e. Secondary effects associated with the construction of sewage facilities, including water quality planning related to air quality maintenance.
6. The water quality control plan for the San Diego Basin has been approved by the State Board. The existing water quality control and municipal waste treatment facilities planning contained therein will provide for control of point source municipal waste discharges.
7. The Santa Margarita-San Luis Rey Watershed Planning Agency is conducting studies of groundwater mineralization.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the boundaries of the San Diego Area, as shown on Exhibit I and consisting of that portion of San Diego County lying west of Anza Borrego State Desert Park and tributary to the Pacific Ocean between the California-Mexico boundary and the Orange and Riverside County lines, including that portion of Riverside County within the Santa Margarita-San Luis Rey watershed, are designated as the boundaries of a 208 areawide waste treatment management planning area, and the Comprehensive Planning Organization is designated as the areawide waste treatment management planning agency for such area.
2. The foregoing designation is subject to the following conditions:
  - a. The designated planning agency shall conform to the provisions of and execute all agreements required by the Board's "Program for Development and Implementation of Areawide Waste Treatment Management Plans - Part I, Designated Areas and Agencies".
  - b. The planning process established pursuant to the designation shall not be used to delay, or duplicate municipal waste treatment facilities planning or implementation undertaken pursuant to Section 201 of the 1972 Amendments to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act. The following facilities shall, therefore, be carried out as part of the Board's Clean Water Grant program and will be considered as existing for 208 planning purposes in the San Diego Area.

- c. The planning process shall be coordinated closely with the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board and provision made for Regional Board participation.
- d. Adequate participation in the 208 planning process must be provided to all appropriate local and regional agencies, including the Santa Margarita-San Luis Rey Watershed Planning Agency.

- e. The 208 planning process must provide for identification, consideration, and mitigation of the impact of water quality factors existing in that portion of the Santa Margarita-San Luis Rey Watershed Planning area lying outside of San Diego County.
- f. Within three months following the date of a grant award by the Environmental Protection Agency, the Comprehensive Planning Organization shall submit a final work plan for the approval of the Board.

CERTIFICATION


