

In the Matter of the Petition of Kimberly-Clark Corporation to Review Action by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region

Order No. 71-32

On August 20, 1971, Kimberly-Clark Corporation filed a petition with the State Water Resources Control Board, here-inafter referred to as the State Board, regarding Order No. 72-3 of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, hereinafter referred to as the Regional Board. The petition requests review by the State Board of certain waste discharge requirements prescribed by the Regional Board in Order No. 72-3 on the grounds that the Regional Board acted unreasonably and exceeded its statutory authority.

The State Board has reviewed the records of the Regional Board and finds that the evidence received at the hearing may be insufficient to establish the appropriateness of the Regional Board action regarding requirements 17a and 17b in Order 72-3 and that those requirements should be reviewed.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT the petition of Kimberly-Clark Corporation be, and it is hereby, granted and that a hearing be held at a time and place to be announced later, to review the action of the Regional Board.
