ORDER NO. R5-2011-0052

RESCINDING WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS (WDR)

- a) Southwest Hide Waste Water Ponds, M&L Commodities, Order R5-2004-0018
 Order No. R5-2004-0018 adopted on 30 January 2004, prescribes requirements for
 M&L Commodities (current owner) for corrective action and post-closure of two waste
 water ponds. The provisions of the order have been satisfied, contaminated soil has
 been removed from the site and the footprint of the former ponds covered with clean
 soil and asphalt parking lot. Subsequent groundwater monitoring results demonstrate
 the Corrective Actions at the site have eliminated or reduced the source of pollutants;
 groundwater quality is improving; and contaminant levels are projected to achieve
 cleanup levels in a reasonable period of time. Continued post-closure monitoring is
 unnecessary. (RDA)
- b) Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. R5-2005-0178, adopted on 29 November 2005, prescribes the requirements for the injection of a chemical oxidant (potassium permanganate) into the aquifer during a phased treatability study to remediate the residual VOC contamination in the B aquifer and the saturated portion of the A aquifer zone at the former Davis Global Communications Site in Yolo County. This phase of the treatability study has been completed and the injection of the chemical oxidant ceased on 28 February 2006. A reduction in solvent concentrations was observed at the Site; however, the treatment technology proved to be cost-prohibitive. Because the above-referenced WDRs are no longer needed, Order No. R5-2005-0178 should be rescinded. A treatability study is currently underway at the Site under the General Order for the passive injection of emulsified vegetable oil (EVO). If this treatment technology goes full-scale, new WDRs may be issued. (CM)
