Thank you for the notice dated September 26, 2013 asking us to review and provide any comments on the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board's (Central Valley Water Board) proposed amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Basins to establish a drinking water policy for surface waters of the Delta and its upstream tributaries (Drinking Water Policy).

The comments the state and regional Water Boards provided to our Delta Plan were very helpful in our public review process. We trust these comments will be helpful to you.

The Delta Reform Act of 2009 (Act) established the Delta Stewardship Council and required the Council to develop a Delta Plan to further the achievement of the coequal goals of providing a more reliable water supply for California and protecting, restoring, and enhancing the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta (Delta) ecosystem (Water Code sections 85054 and 85300(a)). In addition, the coequal goals are to be achieved in a manner that protects and enhances the unique cultural, recreational, natural resource, and agricultural values of the Delta as an evolving place. On May 16, 2013, the Council adopted the Delta Plan, which was required to include measures to promote a more reliable water supply including improving water quality to protect human health and the environment (Water Code section 85302 (d)(3)). The Delta Plan contains 12 recommendations specifically related to water quality improvements in the Delta.

One Delta Plan recommendation is specific to this current Basin Plan amendment process:

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board should complete the Central Valley Drinking Water Policy by July 2013 (Recommendation WQ R4, Chapter 6: Improve Water Quality to Protect Human Health and the Environment)

Conclusion

We have reviewed the Drinking Water Policy adopted by the Central Valley Water Board on July 26, 2013 (R5-2013-0098) and have concluded it has the potential to improve water supply reliability by improving water quality in the Delta. The Drinking Water Policy is based on the best available science, and is a well-considered approach to addressing significant water quality issues for municipal water supplies. It strikes a good balance between flexibility and effectiveness.
