RESOLUTION NO. 70-39

COMMENTING ON APPLICATIONS FOR FEDERAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE
UNDER THE FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT, AS AMENDED;
1970-71 FISCAL YEAR

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

1. Applications for Federal financial assistance under the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, have been filed with this Regional Board in accordance with the procedures adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board in California Administrative Code, Title 23, Chapter 3.
2. The State Water Resources Control Board has reported that the State's Federal allocation for the 1970-71 fiscal year will be sufficient to waive the grouping and ranking of projects and requested that only the following be determined:
 - A. Whether waste discharge requirements are current or must be updated.
 - B. Whether projects are compatible with a coordinated sewerage plan needed by the area, or else should not be included in the priority list.
 - C. Whether any applications are for sewerage facilities proposed to serve an undeveloped area.
3. The Regional Board's staff has advised those applicants needing updated requirements that "Report of Waste Discharge" must be filed and revised waste discharge requirements must be obtained before projects are certified to the State Water Resources Control Board pursuant to Section 2128 California Administrative Code, Title 23, Chapter 3.
4. This Regional Board on April 23, 1970 reviewed the staff report to the Board relative to the applications for Federal financial assistance and heard all interested parties present and desiring to be heard.

RESOLVED BY THIS REGIONAL BOARD

1. Adopts the attached classification regarding compatibility of the proposed projects with coordinated sewerage planning and notifies the applicants in "Category B" that:
 - A. Additional information must be provided to document to the satisfaction of this Board's Executive Officer that the project would conform to the general concepts of Phase I of the Plan recommended by the Final Bay-Delta Program Report.

- B. The project will not be certified to the State Water Resources Control Board pursuant to Section 2128(e) California Administrative Code, Title 23, Chapter 3 until the applicant demonstrates that the project is compatible.
2. Recommends that the State Water Resources Control Board require the American Canyon County Water District to provide additional information to demonstrate whether the proposed interceptor sewer will serve an undeveloped area.
