

ORDER REQUIRING THE RODEO SANITARY DISTRICT
OF CONTRA COSTA COUNTY TO CEASE AND DESIST
FROM DISCHARGING WASTES CONTRARY TO REQUIRE-
MENTS PRESCRIBED BY THE CALIFORNIA REGIONAL
WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD, SAN FRANCISCO
BAY REGION

ORDER NO. 71-58

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region,
finds:

A. On June 24, 1971 this regional board adopted Order No. 71-49 prescribing
discharge requirements covering the discharge of the Rodeo Sanitary District,
hereinafter referred to as the discharger.

B. The discharge requirements provide, in part, as follows:

"... .."

2. The discharge of Waste "A" shall not cause:

a. Floating, suspended, or deposited macroscopic particulate
matter or foam in waters of the State at any place;

... ..

3. Waste "A" as discharged from Outfall "A" shall meet these
quality limits at all times:

... ..

b. In any representative set of samples:

... ..

Coliform Organisms	10,000 MPN/100 ml, maximum, any single sample, when verified by a repeat sample taken within 48 hours ..."

C. Inspection and reports received by board staff and data submitted by the
discharger indicate that the discharger is violating and/or threatening
to violate the requirements for:

Receiving water floating matter and disinfection.

D. On August 23, 1971, after due notice to the discharger and all other
affected persons, a hearing panel of the regional board conducted a public
hearing at which the discharger appeared and evidence was received concern-
ing the discharges.

- E. Upon the basis of the evidence received, the hearing panel recommended that the board issue a cease and desist order against the discharger requiring that he comply with the aforesaid requirements as indicated below.
- F. The requirements being violated or threatened to be violated are as follows:
1. Floating particulate matter in the receiving water at the point of waste discharge.
 2. Disinfection of the effluent.
- G. Any increase in the discharges of waste to the Rodeo Sanitary District will further unreasonably impair water quality.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT

- A. The Rodeo Sanitary District cease and desist from discharging wastes contrary to requirements listed in B, above.
- B. Compliance with the Board's discharge requirements be completed forthwith.
- C. Additional discharges to the Rodeo Sanitary District sewer system not discharging to the system prior to issuance of this order are prohibited subject to the following conditions:
1. The prohibition does not apply to buildings under construction or to building or sewer connection permits issued prior to August 26, 1971.
 2. Additional connections to the sewer system will be permitted as a result of interim corrective measures only when this Board is satisfied that the loading on the receiving waters is not increased beyond the loading prior to the issuance of this order.
- D. If, in the opinion of the Executive Officer, the discharger fails to comply with the provisions of this order, the Executive Officer is directed to request the Attorney General to take the appropriate enforcement action against the discharger, including injunction and civil monetary remedies, if appropriate.
