ORDER NO. 71-63

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR
WILLIAM PACHECO DAIRY FARM ONTO LAND
AT 750 CHILENO VALLEY ROAD, 2 MILES
SOUTHWEST OF PETALUMA, SONOMA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, finds that:

1. Waste from the dairy herd and milking barn on the Pacheco farm flows under the Chileno Valley Road through a culvert or culverts to an unnamed creek. The unnamed creek channel crosses a neighbor's property and is tributary to San Antonio Creek.
2. William Pacheco, called the discharger below, was requested in a letter dated May 4, 1971 to file a report of waste discharge by June 1, 1971 with this Regional Board but has failed to do so.
3. The Board adopted an Interim Water Quality Control Plan for the San Francisco Bay Basin on June 14, 1971.
4. The beneficial uses of the unnamed creek, San Antonio Creek and contiguous waters are:

Domestic water supply

Agricultural livestock watering

Wading and fishing

Fish, and wildlife propagation and sustenance, and waterfowl and migratory birds habitat and resting

Esthetic appeal

5. Land within 1000 feet of the discharge is used for residence, pasture and transportation.
6. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for the discharge.
7. The Board at a public meeting on August 26, 1971 heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.

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IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:

A. Waste Discharge Requirements

1. The disposal of waste shall not create a nuisance as defined in Section 13050(m) of the California Water Code.
2. The waste discharge shall be effectively confined to the discharger's property at all times.
3. The disposal of waste shall not cause ground water suitable for domestic use to exceed any of the limits contained in the most recent edition of the United States Public Health Service's Drinking Water Standards or any modifications or additions relating to drinking water quality adopted by the California State Board of Health.

B. Provisions

1. This Order includes items numbered 1, 6 and 7 of the attached "Reporting Requirements" dated August 28, 1970.
2. This Order includes items numbered 1, 2, 3 and 5 of the attached "Notifications" dated January 6, 1970.

C. Time Schedule

The discharger shall comply with the requirements in this order by September 1, 1971.
