ORDER NO. 71-66

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
FOR  
ARTHUR HASKINS FILL SITE  
SAN MATEO COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, finds that:

1. Arthur Haskins is discharging solid waste material into San Francisco Bay at the foot of Grand Avenue in South San Francisco.
2. An inspection by a member of the Board's staff on July 19, 1971 revealed that the discharge consisted mostly of Class III wastes; however a small quantity of Class II wastes such as cut vegetation, several metal cans, an auto seat and a box spring were being incorporated into the fill.
3. The beneficial water uses of San Francisco Bay in the vicinity of this disposal site are:

Swimming, water-skiing, skin-diving, wading, pleasure boating, marinas, fishing, shellfishing, and hunting

Fish, shellfish, and wildlife propagation and sustenance, and waterfowl and migratory birds habitat and resting

Industrial water supply for processing-production of chemicals

Esthetic enjoyment.

4. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for this discharge.
5. This Board at a public meeting on September 23, 1971 heard and considered all comments pertaining to this discharge.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, Arthur Haskins shall comply with the following:

A. Discharge Specifications

1. The treatment or disposal of waste shall not create a nuisance as defined in Section 13050 (m) of the California Water Code.
2. Waste material shall be confined to the disposal site at all times.
3. This site shall be limited to the disposal of Class III material as defined in Board Resolution No. 69-42.

4. The discharge of waste shall not:

Cause any alteration in turbidity or discoloration beyond natural background levels in waters of the State at any place.

Cause floating, suspended, or deposited macroscopic particulate matter, foam, oil or grease in waters of the State at any place.

Cause surface waters of the State to exceed the following limits of quality at any place:

Dissolved Oxygen	5.0 mg/l minimum
Dissolved Sulfide	0.1 mg/l maximum
pH	7.0 minimum 8.5 maximum
Other substances	Any one or more substances in concentrations that impair any of the protected beneficial water uses or make aquatic life or wildlife unfit or unpalatable for consumption.

B. Provisions

1. This Board considers the property owner to have a continuing responsibility for correcting any problems which may arise in the future as a result of this waste discharge.
2. This Order includes items numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of the attached "Notifications" dated January 6, 1970.
3. This Order includes items numbered 1 and 6 of the attached "Reporting Requirements" dated August 28, 1970.

C. Time Schedule

The discharger shall comply with the "Discharge Specifications" of "A" above forthwith.
