ORDER NO. 78-53

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR:

COUNTY OF SANTA CLARA
GENERAL SERVICES AGENCY
LONG TERM RESIDENTIAL ALCOHOLIC REHABILITATION FACILITY
COYOTE, SANTA CLARA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, (hereinafter Board) finds that:

1. The County of Santa Clara's General Services Agency (hereinafter discharger) submitted a Report of Waste Discharge, dated October 17, 1977, for its long-term Residential Alcoholic Rehabilitation Facility.
2. The discharger proposes to discharge about 9,000 gallons per day of domestic wastes from 110 residents, visitors, and employees to a subsurface leachfield after treatment by dual 7,500 gallon septic tanks as shown on Attachment A, hereinafter a part of this Order. Domestic water is obtained from an off-site well.
3. The Board adopted a Water Quality Control Plan for the San Francisco Bay Basin in April 1975.
4. The beneficial uses of the Santa Clara Valley ground waters as set forth in the Basin Plan include:
 - Domestic water supply
 - Agricultural water supply
 - Industrial process water supply
5. Land within 2,000 feet of the facility is used for residences, transportation and recreation.
6. The County of Santa Clara's Transportation Agency has prepared a negative declaration in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et. seq.) and State Guidelines.
7. The Board has reviewed the negative declaration and determined there will be no substantial adverse changes in the environment as a result of the project.
8. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for the discharge and has provided them with an opportunity for a public hearing and an opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations.
9. The Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the County of Santa Clara in order to protect the beneficial uses identified in 4 and 5 above shall comply with the following:

A. Prohibitions

1. There shall be no surfacing of wastewater effluent at any time.
2. No domestic wastewaters shall be allowed to escape from the discharger's property into the waters of the State via surface flow or surfacing after percolation.
3. There shall be no bypassing or overflow of the collection system or treatment facility.

B. Discharge Specification

1. The treatment or disposal of waste shall not create a nuisance as defined in Section 13050 of the California Water Code.
2. Disposal of the wastes shall not cause degradation of ground water suitable for domestic use or cause an increase in any quality parameter that would make ground water unsuitable for irrigation use.

C. Provisions

1. All portions of this Order shall be complied with immediately upon commencement of discharge.
2. The discharger shall file with the Regional Board technical reports of self-monitoring performed according to detailed specifications contained in a monitoring and reporting program as directed by the Executive Officer.
3. The discharger shall permit the Regional Board or its authorized representative:
 - a. Entry upon premises in which an effluent source is located or in which any required records are kept.
 - b. Access to copy any records required to be kept under terms and conditions of this order.
 - c. Inspection of any monitoring equipment or method required by this order.
 - d. Sampling of any discharge.
4. The discharger shall maintain in good working order and operate as efficiently as possible any facility or control system installed to achieve compliance with the waste discharge requirements.


5. The discharger shall file with the Regional Board a report of waste discharge at least 120 days before making any material change or proposed change in the character, location or volume of the discharge.
6. This Board will review this Order periodically and may revise the requirements when necessary.
7. In the event of any change in control or ownership of the land or the waste discharge facilities presently owned or controlled by the discharger, the discharger shall notify the succeeding owner or operator of the existence of this Order by a letter, a copy of which shall be forwarded to this Board.
