Dear Mr. Muller,

The San Francisco Bay does have trash in it, I wouldn't say it's "full" of trash like many that have written you, but it does pose a threat to wildlife and you and I. What's worse is the pollutants that trash leave in the water, take the example of Boston Harbor's PCB DDT level's that cause the flounder to be inedible, and let's not forget the Cleveland's Cuyahoga River which caught fire on June 22nd, 1969; it's easier to stop pollutants from going into the river than it is to clean them up after it's too late.

Therefore, the boards proposed permit that would require cities and counties to meet a cleanup level of a mere 100 pieces of trash for every 100 feet of trash in heavily polluted "hot spot" is woefully inadequate; we must push for a complete clean-up effort; no cutting corners, we don't want another 6/22 to happen, not to the Bay Area, not on our watch:
