SUBJECT: Rescinding Cease and Desist Orders, Time Schedule Orders, and Cleanup and Abatement Orders

REPORT: Following is a proposed order rescinding Cease and Desist Orders, Time Schedule Order, and Cleanup and Abatement Orders

a	<p>City of Colusa Wastewater Treatment Plant, Colusa County</p> <p>On 1 March 2002, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cease and Desist Order (CDO) R5-2002-0021 and on 22 June 2007 adopted Time Schedule Order (TSO) R5-2007-0074 for the City of Colusa Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). The WWTP is owned and operated by the City of Colusa (Discharger). The CDO and TSO required the Discharger to comply with effluent limitations for aluminum, ammonia, biochemical oxygen demand, copper, total coliform organisms, total suspended solids, and to provide oxidized, coagulated, and filtered or equivalent treatment.</p> <p>The Discharger has achieved compliance by expending \$15,500,000 on the construction of a new WWTP and as of June 2010, fully complies with the effluent limitations in the WDRs, the CDO, and TSO. Therefore, Orders R5-2002-0021 and R5-2007-0074 are no longer necessary.</p>
b	<p>City of Nevada City Wastewater Treatment Plant, Nevada County</p> <p>On 26 April 2002, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cease and Desist Order (CDO) R5-2002-0051 for the City of Nevada City Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). On 25 April 2003, the Central Valley Water Board adopted amended CDO R5-2002-0051-A01. The WWTP is owned and operated by the City of Nevada City (Discharger). The CDO required the Discharger to comply with effluent limitations for ammonia, total nitrate plus nitrite, total nitrite, and pH by 30 April 2007.</p> <p>The Discharger has achieved compliance by expending \$5.59 million for the design and construction of an expansion and upgrade project which was completed in June 2008.</p>
c	<p>City of Williams Wastewater Treatment Plant, Colusa County</p> <p>On 27 August 2007, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Time Schedule Order (TSO) R5-2007-0096 and on 11 September 2008 adopted Resolution R5-2008-0139 for the City of Williams Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). The TSO and Resolution required the City of Williams to comply with effluent limitations for ammonia, biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids, turbidity, total coliform organisms, chlorine residual. The TSO also required wastewater to be oxidized, coagulated, and filtered or equivalent treatment, and required 85 percent removal of BOD and TSS.</p> <p>The Discharger has achieved compliance by expending in excess of \$23 million on a new wastewater treatment plant, which commenced operation in June 2011. Therefore, Order R5-2007-0096 and Resolution R5-2008-0139 are no longer necessary.</p>

d	<p>City of Yuba City, Wastewater Treatment Plant, Sutter County</p> <p>On 6 June 2003, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cease and Desist Order (CDO) R5-2003-0086 for the City of Yuba City (Discharger) Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF). The CDO required the Discharger to comply with effluent limitations for organochlorine pesticides, aluminum, ammonia, diazinon, electrical conductivity, ethion, iron, manganese, and molybdenum by 1 March 2008.</p> <p>The Discharger petitioned CDO R5-2003-0086 to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB). On 22 June 2004, the SWRCB remanded Order R5-2003-0086 to the Central Valley Water Board. On 28 January 2010, the Central Valley Water Board issued WDRs Order R5-2007-0134-01 containing new effluent limitations. The Discharger is in compliance with the limitations in Order R5-2007-0134-01. Therefore, Cease and Desist Order R5-2003-0086 is no longer necessary</p>
e	<p>Hammonton Gold Village Wastewater Treatment Plant, Yuba County</p> <p>On 7 June 2002, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cease and Desist Order (CDO) R5-2002-0102 for the River Highlands Community Services District. On 17 November 2006, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cleanup and Abatement Order (CAO) R5 2006 0730 for the River Highlands Community Services District and Gold Village Land Development, LLC. Among other items, the CDO and CAO required compliance with effluent limitations for ammonia, total residual chlorine residual, nitrate plus nitrite, nitrite, and to cease discharge of improperly treated wastewater.</p> <p>The wastewater treatment plant has been upgraded through construction of a tertiary membrane bioreactor and as of July 2012, fully complies with the effluent limitations in WDRs Order R5 2011 0086. Therefore, Orders R5 2002 0102 and R5 2006 0730 are no longer necessary.</p>
f	<p>Sacramento Area Sewer District, Walnut Grove Wastewater Treatment Plant, Sacramento County</p> <p>On 24 October 2008, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Time Schedule Order (TSO) R5-2008-0163 for the Sacramento Area Sewer District (Discharger), Walnut Grove Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). The TSO required the Discharger to comply with the effluent limitations by 1 June 2010.</p> <p>As of 10 December 2010, the Discharger has fully complied with the TSO. The Walnut Grove WWTP is no longer in use and all wastewater is piped to the Sacramento Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant. Therefore, TSO R5-2008-0163 is no longer necessary.</p>

g	<p>United Auburn Indian Community, Thunder Valley Casino Wastewater Treatment Plant, Placer County</p> <p>On 17 March 2005, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cease and Desist Order (CDO) R5-2005-0033 for the Thunder Valley Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). The WWTP is owned and operated by the United Auburn Indian Community (Discharger). The CDO required the Discharger to comply with the effluent limitations for aluminum, ammonia, arsenic, atrazine, boron, electrical conductivity, fluoride, MBAS, nitrate, persistent chlorinated hydrocarbon pesticides, sulfate, and total trihalomethanes by 11 March 2008.</p> <p>The Discharger has made improvements and complied with the requirements of the CDO. Therefore, Order R5-2005-0033 is no longer necessary.</p>
h	<p>University of California, Davis, Main Wastewater Treatment Plant, Yolo County</p> <p>The University of California, Davis (Discharger) owns and operates the main campus wastewater treatment plant (WWTP). On 30 January 2003, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Cease and Desist Order (CDO) R5-2003-0004. On 18 March 2004, the Central Valley Water Board adopted R5-2003-0004 Amendment No. 1. The CDOs required the Discharger to comply with effluent limitations for total copper, cyanide, electrical conductivity, total iron, and nitrate plus nitrite by 30 December 2007.</p> <p>The Discharger has achieved compliance by completing the tasks in the CDOs. Therefore, CDOs R5-2003-0004 and R5-2003-0004 Amendment No. 1 are no longer necessary.</p>

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the proposed order.
