**NOTICE OF APPLICATION, OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT, AND PUBLIC HEARING
FOR
DISCHARGE PERMIT**

**Rodeo Sanitary District
800 San Pablo Avenue, Rodeo, Contra Costa County**

The above discharger has filed an application for reissuance of a permit under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. The San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board's staff has prepared a tentative permit for this discharger, containing limitations and provisions in accordance with the Federal Clean Water Act and the California Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act.

The above Discharger owns and operates the Rodeo Sanitary District Water Pollution Control Facility (Facility) and associated collection system. The Facility provides secondary treatment of domestic and municipal wastewater for approximately 8,900 people in Rodeo and Tormey. The Facility has an average dry weather design treatment capacity of 1.14 million gallons per day (MGD). Treated, disinfected wastewater is discharged through an offshore outfall to San Pablo Bay.

The deadline for comment on the tentative permit is 5:00 p.m. on February 24, 2012. Comments must be sent to the **attention of Marcia Y. Liao**. Persons wishing to file written comments on or objections to the tentative permit or other aspects of this matter must do so no later than this deadline so that such comments may be considered. No written comments will be accepted or responded to in writing if received after the deadline.

The Board intends to consider adopting the tentative permit during a meeting to commence at 9:00 a.m. on April 11, 2012, in the Auditorium of the Elihu Harris State Building at 1515 Clay Street in Oakland. Interested persons are invited to attend and express their views at the public hearing. The Board will hear oral testimony, but will not accept written comments after the comment deadline noted above.

Pursuant to section 2050(c) of Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, any party that challenges the Board's action on this matter through a petition to the State Water Resources Control Board under Water Code section 13320 will be limited to raising only those substantive issues or objections that were raised before the Board at the public hearing or in timely submitted written correspondence.

All documents related to the tentative permit may be inspected and copied at the Board office. The tentative permit, fact sheet, and any additional information and developments on this matter are also available at www.waterboards.ca.gov/sanfranciscobay.
