NOTICE OF ADOPTED ORDER NO. R8-2013-0029

At its regular meeting held on May 3, 2013, the Regional Board adopted Order No. R8-2013-0029, General Waste Discharge Requirements for In Situ Groundwater Remediation at Sites Within the Santa Ana Region (In Situ Remediation Order). A copy of the In Situ Remediation Order can be downloaded from our website at:

Anyone who proposes to inject/discharge chemicals (amendments) associated with soil and groundwater cleanup activities must obtain authorization under the In Situ Remediation Order. To obtain authorization under this Order, it will be necessary to complete the Application/Report of Waste Discharge Form 200, which can be found at:

http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/publications_forms/forms/docs/form200.pdf, and submit it to us, with the remedial action plan (RAP) for your project, and the required fee of \$3,422.00. For more information regarding the State Water Resources Control Board's annual fee schedule, please go to: http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/resources/fees/docs/fy12_13_fee_schedule.pdf.

We will review the completed Form 200 and the RAP, and if appropriate, send a discharge authorization letter, together with a copy of the required Monitoring and Reporting Program. Please note that we may determine that the issuance of individual waste discharge requirements is appropriate, or that the proposed discharge represents a higher Threat to Water Quality and/or Complexity. In that case, the applicant will be advised of any further steps or additional fees necessary to complete the application process. If an applicant wishes to be regulated by individual waste discharge requirements, rather than the general In Situ Remediation Order, they should contact us as soon as possible for further instructions.
