

You have opened an area prime for disease without consultation from those agencies, both the California Department of Public Health and the Center for Disease Control and the financial implications of worldwide disease outbreak on persons, animals and industries.

You have not identified funding for positions, in any agency, to execute any type of oversight.

You require no testing sufficient to establish any baseline or quality control.

Your concern is for "receiving waters" only and no concern for air-borne disease.

You do not take into consideration the soils and geology including high water tables, earthquake faults and oil and methane gas emissions.

Beneficial use opens up this water to non-agency receivers without the operational organization to execute any type of water quality.

This approval will allow wastewater as irrigation water for parks and for urban farming with no controls even required. In the case of the LA River (wastewater discharges), Lauren Bon, an individual, has been given water rights, to use on a water wheel project with the intent to irrigate (state and local) parks, schools and supply irrigation for food production.

Missing are the health risk assessments for children and the elderly. Missing are scientific studies on the effects on birds and wildlife.

Developing housing within an area is not under your jurisdiction. All types of infrastructure and utility needs are necessary for housing development. General Plans and their Elements are required to be filed by Local Governments. Water supply is a function of the agency supplying the water, not the oversight agency.

Public Health and Safety should be your priority, not just water supply.

You DO need CEQA Environmental Impact Report with alternatives and mitigation measures for the long-term implications and damage.

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
