## **ORDER**

Treated Waste Water Change Petition WW-7

ORDER APPROVING CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE AND PURPOSE OF USE OF TREATED WASTE WATER

## WHEREAS:

- Treated Waste Water change petition WW-7 was filed by Napa Sanitation District on January 18, 1990, pursuant to Sections 1210 and 1211 of the California Water Code.
- 2. The change petition was filed with the State Water Resources Control Board (Board) to obtain Board approval under Sections 1211 and 1700 of the California Water Code to change the Place of Use and Purpose of Use of treated waste water from the Soscol Oxidation Ponds located south of the City of Napa.
- 3. The Board has determined that good cause for the changes has been shown.
- 4. The Board has determined that the changes do not constitute the initiation of a new right nor operate to the injury of any other lawful user of water.

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. The source of treated waste water shall be from the Soscol Oxidation Ponds within the SW1 of NW1 of Section 35, T5N, R4W. MND&M.
- The additional Place of Use shall be Kennedy Park and Golf Course, Napa College grounds and Bedford Industrial Park;
   370 acres within projected Section 14, 22, 23, 26 and 35, T5N, R4W, MDB&M, as shown on a map on file with the Board.
- The Purpose of Use shall be for irrigation of golf courses, parks and landscaping.
- 4. All transmission and distribution pipeline alignments shall be located to avoid known cultural resources sites. A professional archaeologist shall be employed to survey in detail all acres to be impacted by the proposed projects that have not previously been subjected to intensive cultural resource surveys. These studies shall identify all cultural resources, determine their significance and potential eligibility to the National Register, and propose measures to insure avoidance or mitigation or project impacts. The applicant will provide the State Water Resources Control Board with copies of all future cultural resources documents and recommendations.

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5. Any work undertaken on a historic structure must conform with the U.S. Secretary of the Interior's "Standards for Rehabilitation" and associated "Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Structures".

Historical and archaeological societies and the State Water Resources Control Board staff shall be notified of proposals that could affect significant historical and archaeological resources as specified by Napa County.

6. If any subsurface archaeological remains are discovered during construction, all work shall be stopped in the vicinity of the find and a qualified archaeologist consulted. Project personnel shall not collect cultural resources.
