POTENTIAL CHANGES TO THE WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLAN FOR THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY-SACRAMENTO/SAN JOAQUIN DELTA ESTUARY: SAN JOAQUIN RIVER FLOWS AND SOUTHERN DELTA WATER QUALITY.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) has completed a draft Substitute Environmental Document (SED) on the proposed update to the Water Quality Control Plan for the San Francisco Bay/Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Estuary (Bay-Delta Plan). The proposed changes include revised Water Quality Objectives for the Protection of Southern Delta Agricultural Beneficial Uses, San Joaquin River Flow Objectives for the Protection of Fish and Wildlife Beneficial Uses, as well as a Program of Implementation for those Objectives. The State Water Board is proposing to update the Bay-Delta Plan in accordance with a regulatory program exempt under Section 21080.5 of the Public Resources Code from the requirement to prepare an environmental impact report (EIR) under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seg.) and with other applicable laws and regulations.

BACKGROUND

The Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act and the federal Clean Water Act require the State Water Board to regularly review and update the Bay-Delta Plan. The Bay-Delta Plan, last updated in 2006 (the 2006 Bay-Delta Plan), identifies beneficial uses of water in the Bay-Delta estuary, water quality objectives to protect those uses, and a program of implementation to achieve the water quality objectives. In 2009 the State Water Board initiated review of the San Joaquin River flow and southern Delta water quality objectives and the program of implementation for those objectives included in the 2006 Bay-Delta.

CEQA authorizes the Secretary of Natural Resources to certify a regulatory program of a State agency as exempt from the requirements for preparing an EIR, negative declaration, and initial studies if certain criteria are met (Public Resources Code Section 21080.5). The State Water Board's regulations for adoption or revision for any water quality control planning program (23 CCR 3775 – 3781) are an exempt regulatory program and a SED, as required by 23 CCR 3777, is the appropriate document for assessing the environmental impacts of the State Water Board's proposed project, in lieu of an EIR. This SED is prepared in compliance with the State Water Board's regulations, analyzes a reasonable range of alternatives, and evaluates significant environmental impacts that may be associated with the potential changes to the San Joaquin River flow and southern Delta water quality objectives and the program of

implementation for these objectives. The SED also identifies possible ways to minimize significant impacts. The SED meets the requirements of the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Act including the requirement to consider economics when adopting changes to the Bay-Delta Plan.

SIGNIFICANT ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS ANTICIPATED AS A RESULT OF THE PLAN

As more fully described in the SED, adoption and implementation of the draft water quality objectives and the program of implementation would have significant environmental effects. Depending on actions taken by affected persons, adoption and implementation of the amendment to the plan could result in significant impacts to the following resources: water supply, surface hydrology, and water quality; flooding, sediment, and erosion; aquatic resources; terrestrial biological resources; groundwater resources; recreational resources and visual quality; agricultural resources; cultural resources; service providers; and energy resources and climate change.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR RECEIPT OF ORAL COMMENTS ON THE ADEQUACY OF THE SED

In accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 3779, the State Water Board will conduct a public hearing for the receipt of oral comments on the adequacy of the SED for the draft revised Bay-Delta Plan objectives and program of implementation. The Board will not consider adoption of the proposed Bay-Delta Plan update or the draft SED at this hearing. Oral comments should be submitted at this hearing. The board is not required to consider any oral comment that is received after the public hearing. Oral comments will be limited to **ten minutes** or as directed by the hearing officer. Although a quorum of the State Water Board may be present at the hearing, the State Water Board will not take an action during the hearing. Approval of the SED will take place at a future Board Meeting.
