

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD  
RESOLUTION NO. 71-50

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER OR CHIEF, DIVISION OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES, TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD AND THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY, TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF DETERGENT BUILDERS

WHEREAS, a large number of products are being proposed and presented to the public as pollution free replacements for the phosphorus builders in detergents, and

WHEREAS, the disposal of these replacements, some of which pose a pollution threat to waters of the State, are under the jurisdiction of the State and Regional Boards, and

WHEREAS, the impact of these replacements must be evaluated by experts in the field for the Board to formulate a position to present to both the public and the legislators seeking direction on this very complicated and emotional subject, and

WHEREAS, the study will present an evaluation of the environmental effects of detergent builders in California through a review of pertinent literature and discussion with experts in the field and will develop an organized compilation of the facts as well as provide water pollution control agencies guidelines for developing rational plans for the regulation of detergent builders, and


WHEREAS, this Board at its August 19, 1971, meeting approved this study in principle, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Board enter into agreement with the Regents of the University of California, Berkeley, for the conduct of this study during the period of August, 1971, through March, 1972, at a cost not to exceed \$6,000 of Clean Water Bond Funds, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board's Executive Officer or Chief, Division of Administrative Services, is authorized to execute the agreement on behalf of the Board.
