## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 83-12

RAMONA MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AND CALIFORNIA REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD, SAN DIEGO REGION'S COMPLIANCE WITH STATE BOARD ORDER NO. W.Q. 81-16

## WHEREAS:

- 1. On February 26, 1979, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region, (Regional Board) adopted Order No. 79-17 renewing waste discharge requirements for Ramona Municipal Water District (RMWD).
- 2. On January 19, 1981, RMWD submitted a report of waste discharge which included arguments for applying the concepts of State Board Order No. W.Q. 80-7 to the waste discharge requirements for its treatment facilities at the San Diego Country Estates.
- 3. On April 27, 1981, the Regional Board adopted Addendum No. 1 to Order No. 79-17 in response to said report of waste discharge.
- 4. On May 15, 1981, RMWD filed a petition with the State Board seeking review of Addendum No. 1 to Order No. 79-17.
- 5. On December 17, 1981, the State Board adopted State Board Order No. W.Q. 81-16, "In the Matter of the Petition of the Ramona Municipal Water District for Review of Addendum No. 1 to Order No. 79-17 of the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board".
- 6. State Board Order No. W.Q. 81-16 requires the following:
  - a. The Regional Board to amend Addendum No. 1 to require compliance with numerical concentration limitations computed on a basis of a 12-month running average.
  - b. RMWD to prepare a report discussing alternative reclamation projects for submission to the Regional Board within six months of the date of the adoption of the order.
  - c. The Regional Board to comment on the report to the State Board concerning possible reclamation projects in RMWD's service area.
- 7. Compliance of State Board Order No. W.Q. 81-16 has been fulfilled by the following actions:
  - a. On March 8, 1982, the Regional Board adopted Addendum No. 2 to Order No. 79-17 incorporating the requirements of said State Board order.

- b. On May 25, 1982, RMWD submitted a report entitled "Wastewater Planning Status Report to the State Water Resources Control Board--San Diego Country Estates Reclamation Facilities--May 1982" to the Regional Board.
- c. By memo dated June 14, I982, the Regional Board commented on the reclamation projects discussed in the report.
- 8. RMWD has subsequently actively pursued Alternative B of the report which is a proposal to irrigate a 160-acre avocado grove called Butterfield Ranch.
- 9. Although there have been contract negotiation delays between RMWD and the owners of Butterfield Ranch in securing reclaimed water delivery, all evidence indicates that ultimate delivery is imminent.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That RMWD and the Regional Board have complied with the requirements of State Board Order No. W.Q. 81-16 as demonstrated in Finding No. 7 of this resolution.
- 2. That as long as RMWD is aggressively pursuing reclamation for its treatment facilities at San Diego Country Estates, RMWD should retain favored project status as a reclamation project under the concepts of State Board Order No. W.Q. 80-7.
- That the Regional Board should take appropriate steps to modify the RMWD waste discharge requirements if it becomes apparent that a valid reclamation project is not implemented.
