RESOLUTION NO. 84- 14

CERTIFYING AN AMENDMENT TO THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF
GOVERNMENTS 208 WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN: GROUND WATER QUALITY
MANAGEMENT PLAN - SAN FERNANDO VALLEY BASIN

WHEREAS:

1. The Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), as the designated 208 planning agency for the South Coast area, prepared the 1979 Areawide Waste Treatment Management Plan, or 208 plan, which was certified by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) and approved by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in 1980.
2. SCAG received a 208 grant for a study to address toxic contamination of ground water in the San Fernando Valley. Working with the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP), SCAG has submitted a "Ground Water Quality Management Plan - San Fernando Valley Basin" technical report (dated July 1983) and a 208 plan amendment (dated October 1983) to the State Board as required by 40 CFR 35.1523.2.
3. The State Board is required by the provisions of 40 CFR 35.1523-3 to evaluate 208 plan amendments and to certify, or not certify, them as being in conformance with the evaluation criteria specified in 40 CFR 35.1523-2 and 35.1533-1; and to inform EPA as to its findings.
4. The State Board has reviewed the technical report and the 208 plan amendment submitted by SCAG, and has found them to be technically adequate and in conformance with the criteria for certification.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

2. Accepts the "Ground Water Quality Management Plan - San Fernando Valley Basin" LADWP technical report.
