

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD
RESOLUTION NO. 90-33

ADOPTION OF WATER QUALITY ASSESSMENT INCORPORATING FEDERAL
CLEAN WATER ACT SECTIONS 303(d), 304(1), 314, AND 319 LISTS
AND 40 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS, SECTION 131.11.

WHEREAS:

1. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) is developing a list of prioritized water quality issues as part of the Clean Water Strategy.
2. The Water Quality Assessment provides information necessary for the development of the Clean Water Strategy.
3. The Water Quality Assessment has been compiled from the nine regional Water Quality Assessments adopted by the respective California Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board).
4. Duly noticed public hearings were conducted on January 31, 1990 and February 15, 1990 for the purpose of public review and comment on the draft statewide Water Quality Assessment and appropriate changes were made to the assessment.
5. A proposed Water Quality Assessment document was made available to the public on January 2, 1990.
6. Section 304(1) of the Clean Water Act, as amended in 1987, requires each state to submit various lists of waterbodies impacted by pollutants to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
7. The Water Quality Assessment includes the Clean Water Act Section 303(d), 304(1), 314, and 319 lists and the list required under 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Section 131.11 for the State of California.
8. All waterbodies identified as affected by nonpoint sources constitute the Nonpoint Source Assessment Report.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the 1990 update of the State of California's Water Quality Assessment is approved, including the lists for Sections 303(d), 304(1), 314, and 319 of the Clean Water Act and 40 CFR 131.11 that are incorporated therein.
2. That the Executive Director is authorized to transmit the lists for Sections 303(d), 304(1), 314, and 319 of the Clean Water Act and 40 CFR 131.11 to EPA to satisfy the requirements of that Act.

3. That the 1990 update of the Water Quality Assessment is complete.
4. That the State Board may review the lists for Sections 303(d), 304(1), 314, and 319 of the Clean Water Act, once the Clean Water Strategy development is complete and the State Board's priorities are made clear.
