RESOLUTION NO. 91-78

APPROVAL OF A STATE REVOLVING FUND (SRF) LOAN FOR
THE STEGE SANITARY DISTRICT
SUNSET/COLUSA-HOFFMAN MARSH RELIEF SEWER

WHEREAS:


1. The State Board on August 18, 1988, adopted the "Policy for Implementing the State Revolving Fund for Construction of Wastewater Treatment Facilities" and amended it on September 20, 1990;
2. The State Board on September 20, 1990, adopted the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 1991 SRF Loan Program Priority List and which includes the Stege Sanitary District's Sunset/Colusa Hoffman Marsh Relief Sewer Project;
3. The Division of Clean Water Programs has approved the project report, environmental documents, and the revenue program for the Sunset/Colusa-Hoffman Marsh Relief Sewer; and
4. The information contained in the Negative Declaration and Initial Study (State Clearinghouse No. 85110505) and in the program EIR (State Clearinghouse No. 90030657) prepared for the project has been reviewed and considered and it has been determined that:
 - A. Changes or alterations have been required in, or incorporated into the project which avoid or substantially lessen the potentially significant environmental impacts identified in the program EIR, and Negative Declaration and Initial Study, with respect to the following aspect of the project: (1) water quality impacts will be mitigated by revegetation, using construction techniques which minimize turbidity or siltation, avoiding construction near waterways, minimizing use of toxic materials, using sedimentation barriers and avoiding discharge of any trench or sewer water into the marsh; (2) biological impacts to the marsh area will be mitigated by using light construction equipment, replanting with native species, scheduling work to avoid high tides, rainfall, diurnal activity of animals and spring vegetation growth, and analyzing improvement of tide flows; (3) soil erosion impacts will be mitigated by using standard erosion controls and high silt fences on the top of the berm.
 - B. With respect to the other potentially significant environmental impacts identified in the Negative Declaration and Initial Study, and program EIR, appropriate changes or alterations are within the responsibility and jurisdiction of other public agencies and such other changes or alterations have been adopted or can and should be adopted by such other agencies.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

Approve the Sunset/Colusa-Hoffman Marsh Relief Sewer for a SRF loan of \$1.9 million, with a repayment period of 20 years and the first repayment due one year after completion of construction.
