RESOLUTION NO. 94-91

CERTIFYING FINAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT
FOR THE AMENDMENT OF THE WATER RIGHT LICENSES
OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES FOR DIVERSION OF WATER
FROM STREAMS TRIBUTARY TO MONO LAKE
(WATER RIGHT LICENSES 10191 AND 10192,
APPLICATIONS 8042 AND 8043)

WHEREAS:

1. The State Water Resources Control Board served as lead agency for preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Report that evaluated a project that consists of:
 - a. The establishment and maintenance of instream flow requirements in the Mono Lake tributaries from which the City of Los Angeles diverts water as necessary to comply with the public trust doctrine, California Fish and Game Code Sections 5937 and 5946, and judicial rulings requiring that license conditions require release of sufficient flow to reestablish and maintain the fisheries that existed in the streams prior to Los Angeles' diversions; and
 - b. The establishment and maintenance of water elevation requirements for Mono Lake and other conditions to provide appropriate protection for public trust resources and beneficial uses of Mono Lake and its tributaries.
2. The Draft Environmental Impact Report was circulated for agency and public review.
3. The State Water Resources Control Board has prepared a Final Environmental Impact Report.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:
