## **Obligations of Smaller Suppliers**

Change Section 865, subdivision (f)(1)(B) to read:

<u>Reduce by</u><u>Implement another mandatory conservation measure or measures intended</u> to achieve a <u>2025</u> percent reduction in<u>its total</u> <u>potable</u> water consumption by the persons it servesproduction</u> relative to the amount <u>consumed</u>produced in 2013."

## Smaller wholesalers (below 3,000 AFA)

Change section 865, subdivision (a)(1) to read:

"Distributor of a public water supply" has the same meaning as under section 350 of the Water Code, except it does not refer to such distributors when they are functioning solely in a wholesale capacity, but does apply to distributors when they are functioning in a retail capacity.

## Self-supplied CII Users with Multiple Sources of Supply

Change section 864, subdivision (c) to read:

Immediately upon this subdivision taking effect, all commercial, industrial and institutional properties that use a water supply, any portion of which is from a source other than not served by a water supplier meeting the requirements of Water Code section 10617 or section 350 subject to section 865, shall either:

(1) Limit outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes or turf with potable water to no more than two days per week; or

(2) Reduce potable water usage supplied by sources other than a water supplier by 25 percent for the months of June 2015 through February 2016 as compared to the amount used from those sources for the same months in 2013.

## Irrigation Outside of Newly Constructed Homes and Buildings

Change section 864, subdivision (a)(8) to read:

The irrigation with potable water of landscapes outside of newly constructed homes and buildings that is not delivered by drip or microspray systems a manner inconsistent with regulations or other requirements established by the California Building Standards Commission and the Department of Housing and Community Development.
