#### ***Vapor Intrusion: The Complete Picture from Fundamentals to Redevelopment - Working Together***

The California Environmental Protection Agency (CalEPA) Vapor Intrusion Workgroup (CalEPA VI Workgroup or Workgroup) is pleased to host five virtual public workshops to share and gain input on CalEPA's efforts to address vapor intrusion at contaminated sites from February through June 2026.

### **Workshop 1: Vapor Intrusion Cleanup Case Basics Training**

This workshop will provide introductory training on the fundamentals of vapor intrusion science and the processes of investigation, cleanup and/or managing vapor intrusion on a property. The training will include high-level explanations of important terms, the cleanup process, and tools and strategies that can be used during the life cycle of a vapor intrusion case. The training will also explain how vapor intrusion data is evaluated and used to support decision-making. Attendees will have opportunities to ask questions and provide comments. The goal of this workshop is to build a foundational understanding of vapor intrusion and to encourage early public participation in vapor intrusion projects within their communities.

### **Workshop 2: Vapor Intrusion in the Community**

This workshop will host a guided discussion and presentations on environmental justice and racial equity at cleanup sites. Workshop speakers will discuss their goals for fair treatment in all communities, including efforts to address environmental justice and racial equity. Attendees can join a guided group discussion on important topics, such as how vapor intrusion affects neighborhoods near contamination and the possible health risks, and efforts by agencies for collaborative engagement with communities. This session is intended to gather public feedback on these key challenges.

### **Background**

The CalEPA VI Workgroup is a multi-agency workgroup consisting of the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), multiple Regional Water Quality Control Boards, and the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) that serves as a technical and regulatory resource for addressing contaminated sites impacted by vapor intrusion across California. The CalEPA VI Workgroup is hosting this 2026 Vapor Intrusion Workshop Series to present and gather feedback on its efforts and approaches to addressing and managing vapor intrusion.

The five upcoming workshops will cover a wide range of topics, including providing introductory training on vapor intrusion, taking a deep dive into vapor intrusion in the community and collaborative engagement, and technical presentations and discussions on a holistic approach to managing vapor intrusion sites. The technical sessions will cover development of conceptual site

models, paths to site closure, collective decision-making, and vapor intrusion data in GeoTracker and EnviroStor.
