Discharger and Tentative Order Information

Shasta-Sustainable Resource Management, Inc. (Discharger) is the owner and operator of the Shasta-Sustainable Resource Management, Inc. (Facility), which is a biomass electrical generation facility located at 20811 Industry Road, Anderson, California. The Facility discharges wastewater to the Anderson Cottonwood Irrigation District Canal, a water of the United States, tributary to the Sacramento River via Crowley Creek, Gotta Creek, Hooker Creek, Patterson Creek, and Cottonwood Creek.

Discharges from the Facility are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements Order R5 2019-0070, adopted by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) on 11 October 2019. An Order is proposed to renew the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Order. The proposed permit includes a Facility name change to "Shasta-Sustainable Resource Management, Inc." under new ownership of the same name. The proposed permit also includes new effluent limitations for alpha-BHC, manganese, and molybdenum. The proposed permit and Time Schedule Order each include a compliance schedule with milestones for the Facility to come into compliance with manganese and alpha-BHC effluent limitations, respectively. The proposed permit includes changes to the onsite septic system/leachfield monitoring and stormwater management, including removal of the Fuel Pile Stormwater Pond berm, which is intended to reduce alpha-BHC, manganese, and molybdenum concentrations in the effluent. A groundwater network assessment is proposed to inform future decisions to protect groundwater quality.

The agenda materials may also include staff revisions to the tentative Orders.

Nature and Purpose of Hearing

At the hearing, the Central Valley Water Board will hear testimony and oral comments regarding the tentative Orders. This proceeding will be a formal adjudicatory proceeding. The procedures governing Central Valley Water Board adjudicatory hearings (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/laws_regulations/) may be found at California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 648 et seq. and are available upon request.

Prehearing Submission of Written Comments and Evidence

The Discharger is a party to this proceeding. As a party, the Discharger must submit written evidence or comments, if any, for the Board to consider no later than 5:00 p.m. on **2 May 2025** to the Central Valley Water Board email at <u>RB5S-NPDES-Comments@waterboards.ca.gov</u>.

Interested persons include any non-party that is interested in the outcome of the hearing. Interested persons wishing to comment, in writing, on the tentative Orders shall submit comments no later than 5:00 p.m. on **2 May 2025** to the Central Valley Water Board email at <u>RB5S-NPDES-Comments@waterboards.ca.gov</u>.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 648.4, the Board Chair may refuse to admit written evidence or comments that are not submitted in accordance with this Notice and shall refuse to do so when there is a showing of prejudice to the Discharger or the Board. Excluded material will not be considered by the Board.

Requesting Party Status

Persons who wish to participate in the hearing as a party must submit a request in writing no later than 5:00 p.m. on **16 April 2025** to the Central Valley Water Board email at <u>RB5S-NPDES-Comments@waterboards.ca.gov</u>. The request must include facts demonstrating how the person will be substantially affected by the proceeding.

The Board Chair will not designate a person as a party if the Board Chair determines the designation will impair the interests of justice and the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceeding. The Board Chair, when granting a request for party status, may impose restrictions on the requestor's hearing participation, including limiting or excluding the use of cross-examination and other procedures to promote the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceeding.

Visual Presentations

Hearing participants may use PowerPoint or other visual presentations at the hearing, but the presentation content shall not exceed the scope of previously submitted written material. Presentations, if any, must be provided to the below Central Valley Water Board Contact by 12:00 p.m. on **17 June 2025**.

Hearing Procedure and Time Limits

The hearing on the tentative Orders will be conducted in the general order listed under California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 648.5, except that the Board Chair may modify the order for good cause.

The **Discharger** and any other designated Party will be advised in advance of the hearing of the total amount of time allocated for their presentation and closing statement. The Discharger and Parties are invited to contact staff in advance of the

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hearing to discuss how much time they believe is necessary.

Interested persons may speak at the hearing and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals, if any. Each interested person will have 3 minutes to present oral comments. Additional time may be provided, upon request, at the discretion of the Board Chair.

Hearing Accommodations

The hearing facilities will be accessible to persons with disabilities.
