# **Tentative Time Schedule Order Information**

Ballantyne Holdings, LLC (Discharger) is the owner and operator of Former Marley Cooling Tower Company (Facility), a groundwater extraction and treatment system located at 200 North Wagner Avenue, Stockton, California. The Facility's treatment system addresses a hexavalent chromium plume in groundwater due to historic operations causing site contamination of soils and groundwater. At the Facility site location, the Discharger previously operated a cooling tower fabrication plant that included a wood preservation process which was discontinued in 1991. Groundwater is extracted from seven operative extraction wells on and off-site. The current groundwater extraction and treatment facility is designed to treat a maximum flow of 0.94 million gallons per day (MGD), but the average daily discharge flow is 0.17 MGD. The Facility's treatment system discharges wastewater into the Stockton Diverting Canal, a water of the United States. The Stockton Diverting Canal is an engineered drainage canal which re-connects Upper Mormon Slough to the Calaveras River on the East side of Stockton.

Discharges from the Facility are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements Order R5-2019-0018 (NPDES No. CA0081787) and are proposed to be regulated by General Order R5-2022-0006-03 for Limited Threat Discharges to Surface Waters under Notice of Applicability (NOA) R5-2022-0006-035 which is scheduled to be issued by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) Executive Officer on 16 January 2025 and become effective 1 April 2025. The Discharger submitted an infeasibility analysis requesting additional time to come into compliance with the final effluent limitations for iron prescribed in NOA R5-2022-0006-035. Therefore, a Time Schedule Order is proposed containing a time schedule for compliance with these final effluent limitations until 31 March 2030.

#### **Comment Period**
