TO ALL CONCERNED PERSONS AND AGENCIES:

Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) staff has determined that the Atwater Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility (Facility) is eligible for coverage under General Order R5-2023-0025 for *Municipal Wastewater Dischargers That Meet Objectives/Criteria at the Point of Discharge to Surface Water* (Municipal General Order). Enclosed is a tentative Notice of Applicability (NOA) for public review and comment.

The City of Atwater is the owner of the Facility but currently contracts Veolia Water West Operating Services Inc. to operate and maintain the Facility. The Facility provides sewerage service for the community of Atwater (population of 31,970 based on 2020 census), the unincorporated community of Winton (population of 11,709 based on 2020 census), and both the Federal Bureau of Prisons – Atwater and the Castle Airport Aviation and Development Center (combined population of approximately 1,500). The design average dry weather flow capacity of the Facility is 6.0 MGD.

The Facility is currently authorized to discharge under previous Municipal General Order R5-2017-0085-02 through NOA R5-2017-0085-001 to discharge disinfected tertiary-

treated municipal wastewater to Peck/Atwater Drain, which is hydraulically connected to the San Joaquin River, a water of the United States, between Sack Dam and the mouth of the Merced River. The tentative NOA, once final and effective, would provide coverage for the Facility's discharge under the Municipal General Order, at which time the terms and conditions in NOA R5-2017-0085-001 will cease to be effective except for enforcement purposes.

Any comments or recommendations you may have concerning the tentative NOA should be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. on **12 July 2024** in order for the Central Valley Water Board's Executive Officer to give them full consideration prior to the finalization and issuance of the NOA. After the close of the public comment period Central Valley Water Board staff will review comments, respond as necessary, and the tentative NOA may be revised if appropriate. If substantial written comments are not received by the due date, the Executive Officer will issue the final NOA in accordance with the Municipal General Order. If substantial comments are received by the due date any member of the public may request an oral hearing before the Central Valley Water Board. If deemed appropriate by the Executive Officer, a subsequent notice of public hearing will be issued so the matter can be considered at a future Central Valley Water Board meeting.
