FINDINGS

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) hereby finds as follows:

Introduction

1. On 17 April 2015, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order R5-2015-0058 to regulate the Foothill Sanitary Landfill (Facility). San Joaquin County Department of Public Works (County) owns, and Foothill Sanitary Landfill, Inc. operates, the Facility. For the purpose of this Order, the County and Foothill Sanitary Landfill, Inc are collectively referred to as “Discharger.”
2. This Order amends WDRs Order R5-2015-0058 to add requirements associated with the construction and use of a proposed Class II surface impoundment at the Facility for the purpose of leachate management. The amendments implemented by this Order are depicted in Attachment 1; newly added content is underlined (e.g., new text), while removed content is shown in strikethrough (e.g., ~~deleted text~~).
3. This Order is accompanied by an updated Monitoring & Reporting Program Order (MRP), which rescinds and replaces the prior operative MRP (i.e., MRP R5-2015-0058).

Procedural Matters

4. All local agencies with regulatory jurisdiction over land-use, solid waste disposal, air pollution and public health protection have approved the use of the Facility’s site for the discharge of waste to land as provided for herein.
5. This Order, which amends an existing WDRs Order to authorize development and operation of a Class II surface impoundment at an existing landfill, is exempt from the procedural requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Pub. Res. Code, § 21000 et seq.) As described in the Findings of WDRs Order R5-2018-0058-01 (Attachment 1), the County, as lead agency for purposes of CEQA, determined based on an environmental review that its proposed activities, as authorized by this Order, constitute minor changes to an existing facility that are exempt from CEQA review pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15301. The Central Valley Water Board has reviewed the County’s environmental review document and Notice of Exemption and determined that the issuance of this Order, which prescribes prohibitions, limitations, and specifications for minimizing water quality impacts from the authorized activities, is likewise exempt from CEQA pursuant to section 15301.

6. The Discharger, interested agencies and interested persons were notified of the Central Valley Water Board's intent to prescribe the WDRs in this Order, and provided an opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations at a public hearing. (Wat. Code, § 13167.5; Cal. Code Regs., tit. 27, § 21730).
7. At a public meeting, the Central Valley Water Board heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharges regulated under this Order.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to Water Code sections 13263 and 13267, that, effective immediately, WDRs Order R5-2015-0058 is revised as shown in underline/strikeout format in Attachment 1, and the newly revised WDR is assigned order number R5-2015-0058-01.
