ORDER NO. 81-7

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR MASSEY SAND AND ROCK North of Indio - Riverside County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

- Massey Sand and Rock Co. (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), P.O. Box 1767, Indio, CA 92202, submitted updated information on the discharge of wastes on October 14, 1980.
- 2. The discharger is discharging an approximate total of 41,000 gallons-per-day of wastewater from facilities consisting of a washer at a sand and gravel plant, which discharges into three unlined basins, and from a washer at an asphalt-sand plant, which discharges into two asphalt-lined basins. Also, about 4,000 gallons-per-day of cement truck washwater is discharged into the lined basins. The wastewater is recirculated for use in the washing operations, plus is spread out on on-site roads for dust control. The disposal basins are located in the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 3, and the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 2, T5S, R7E, SBB&M.
- The discharges from these industrial facilities have been subject to waste discharge requirements adopted in Board Order No. 71-45.
- 4. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the Coachella Hydrologic Subunit.
- 5. The beneficial uses of the groundwater of the Coachella Hydrologic Subunit are:
 - a. Municipal supply
 - b. Industrial supply
 - c. Agricultural supply
 - The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to update waste discharge requirements for the discharge.
 - 7. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.

8. This wastewater disposal operation constitutes an ongoing project in accordance with the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) and Title 23, California Administrative Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter 17, Section 2715, because the governmental approvals on or after April 5, 1973, do not involve a greater degree of responsibility or control over such activity than the governmental approvals received prior to that date.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:

- A. Discharge Specifications
 - Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code.
 - Infiltrating wastewaters shall not contain constituents in excess of the following limits:

- 3. Wastewater with chemical constituents in excess of the limits prescribed in Dischar-e Specification No. 2 (above) shall be retained in impervious basins with ultimate discharge at a location approved by the Regional Board.
- 4. There shall be no surface flow of wastewater away from the designated disposal area.
- 5. Adequate protective works shall be provided to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the disposal facilities inoperable.

B. Provisions

- 1. Prior to any material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in the location of discharge, the discharger shall report thereon to the Board.
- In the event of any change in operation, or in control of ownership of the land used for wastewater disposal, the discharger shall:

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- a. Notify this Board of such change; and
- b. Notify the succeeding owner or operator by letter of the existence of this Order; and file a copy of said letter with the Board.
- 3. The discharger shall comply with "Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 81-7" and future revisions thereto, as specified by the Executive Officer.
- 4. This Order supersedes Board Order No. 71-45.
