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1. LAND DISPOSAL – WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS PROGRAM

2. WATER QUALITY STANDARDS/NON-POINT SOURCE PROGRAM

Yucca Valley OWTS Prohibition Enforcement

On October 6, WQS staff issued 295 notices of violation to owners of properties who have not connected to the collection system to comply with the prohibition of discharge from onsite wastewater treatment systems (OWTS). The notices provided WQS staff's contact information and subsequently staff answered dozens of phone calls and emails to provide additional information and to follow up with dischargers who are experiencing a variety of issues completing their connections. Yucca Valley OWTS Prohibition Revision Basin Plan Amendment OAL Review

Staff coordinated with the State Board Basin Planning liaison on the submittal of the Basin Plan Amendment Administrative record to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for review. The liaison submitted the documents to OAL on October 19, commencing a 30-day review period. [Maria Davydova-Flores, ES]

Salton Sea Habitats Field Trip

On October 25, staff took State Board staff from Division of Water Quality and Division of Water Rights on a tour of the area around the Salton Sea and the California Natural Resources Agency's Species Conservation Habitat Project. State Board staff on the tour were interested in seeing the area to better understand water quality issues and to get information for planning the 2023 Salton Sea workshop. Colorado River Basin Salinity Control Forum Work Group

On October 17, the Colorado River Basin Salinity Control Forum Work Group met virtually to go over presentations and get feedback on information to present to the Forum at the October 24-25 Forum and Advisory Council Meeting in Lake Tahoe. Federal agency partners, including U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), Bureau of

Reclamation (USBR), and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), presented updates on their various salinity control projects in the Basin. Updates were also given on the Triennial Review process and an overview of the model to determine the Colorado River's salt load over the next several years. New data is added to the model prior to every Triennial Review so that it is applicable to current conditions. [Emma McCorkle, Senior ES]

3. UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK AND SITE CLEANUP PROGRAM

Regional Water Board staff continues to work with staff from the Department of Defense (DoD) to expedite ongoing activities at cleanup sites located at military facilities within the Colorado River Basin Region. The Underground Storage Tank (UST) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) staff issued correspondence reviewing technical reports, requesting site access, providing direction for site assessment, and approving remedial action plans for sites currently in the assessment and cleanup process.
