## HEXAVALENT CHROMIUM MAXIMUM CONTAMINANT LEVEL

Comments received during the 45-day comment period led to two modifications to the effect of the proposed regulation, including (1) removal of the proposed requirement that a Compliance Plan include how a public water system would comply by the applicable compliance date and (2) addition of a requirement for a public water system to conduct Tier 2 public notification for a hexavalent chromium maximum contaminant level exceedance occurring before the applicable compliance date. The proposed changes and an Addendum to the Initial Statement of Reasons were submitted to the public for a 15-day comment period. On 17 April 2024, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted the proposed regulation without any further changes to the regulatory effect.

There have been no other changes in applicable laws or regulations or to the effect of the proposed regulation from those described in the Informative Digest contained in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (published in the California Regulatory Notice Register on 16 June 2023, No. 24-Z), which is hereby incorporated by reference.
